It's the last month of the year, and time to prepare for the cold and the snow! In preparing for the cold season, please make sure your pets are kept indoors. Grab your ice melt and snow shovels while they're in stock since the forecasters are predicting a heavy snow season.

The SRHOA meetings will only be held at the Community Center building going forward. This will eliminate any confusion about where the meetings will take place as well as be more accommodating to our residents.

At the November meeting, the Board discussed the pool rules and although the majority of the rules will stay in place, they will be tweaked to include manager's discretion when applying for pool passes.

The draft budget was also reviewed and approved. Due to the cost of removing trees that were hazardous to residential property, the board decided to increase the dues by five percent to have the flexibility to accelerate the removal of the trees in order to minimize and prevent any issues caused by them.

Speaking of budgets, the Board is also deciding what projects to tackle for next year. Trails, Street Lights, the Community Office building, the Community Center floors, as well as other projects are on the list for consideration. Should you see something you would like the Board to consider that will improve the community, please let us know.

We are also in the process of testing an online broadcasting system and eventually hope to have it running in the next month or so. The idea is to be able to have residents listen in on the Board meetings by clicking on a link.

The Board is also working on a memorial bench to be placed near the lake in remembrance of the work and dedication of Alicia Winterbottom to the community of Sugarland Run. Several styles as well as location of the bench is being considered.

You may have noticed some activity at the pool as Antonio LaBarbera, an Eagle Scout, is busily repairing the trim and siding of the pool shed for the Dolphin Swim team. Great work Antonio!

The sign at South Cottage and Seneca Ridge is being reviewed by the insurance company. Hopefully, that sign will be up soon.

Lastly, the final event for the Community Activities Committee (CAC) is Breakfast with Santa which will take place on December 8th from 9:00am-12:00pm in the Community Center. This is always a huge event attended by a lot of residents. Please check out the link on the facebook page and sign up to either give them a head count or to volunteer. Volunteers are always needed at these events and it's what makes them run so well and be so successful.

Indoor Gardening by Diane Bayless

By now, most outdoor plants have gone dormant for the winter, but you can still enjoy living plants inside. Traditional holiday plants such as poinsettia or Christmas cactus are showing up in stores now. These require specific care, especially if you hope to keep them around to bloom year after year. But there are many other houseplants that are fairly easy to maintain and provide a number of benefits.

Houseplants are not for everyone. Some can trigger allergies and many are poisonous to animals and people. But, in general, houseplants can add beauty and interest to your home, hide unwanted views and absorb noise. Many have an added benefit of helping to clean the air and regulate the humidity inside your home. Plants absorb carbon dioxide and release oxygen during photosynthesis. They also release moisture through their leaves which can help improve humidity during our dry winter months. Furthermore, the building materials, plastics, electronics, furniture, carpet, and cleaning products found in our homes often emit low levels of unhealthy pollutants such as carbon monoxide, formaldehyde, benzene and other gases. Many plants are able to absorb these chemicals and help to purify our air.

No houseplant is going to be totally maintenance free, but three plants that are fairly low maintenance and efficient as natural air filters are the Peace Iily (Spathiphyllum), Snake Plant (Sanservia) and Spider Plant (Chlorophytum comosum). English ivy (Hedra helix) can be invasive outside but works great in a hanging basket inside. All have specific needs as far as light, water and soil type so it is important to understand the care instructions for plants you choose and be ever vigilant for plant pests and diseases. Caring for houseplants can be a great household responsibility for children – just keep an eye on them because over-enthusiastic watering kills more houseplants than underwatering!
