The Busy Waiting Time in the Garden by Diane Bayless

March can be either a busy time or a waiting time for gardeners, depending on our unsettled weather. We can have some very warm days and then drop back to snow and freezing temperatures. The soil itself may fluctuate between being frozen to being too wet to handle. Once soil is dry - it no longer drips or sticks together when you squeeze a handful -then garden beds can be prepared for planting by adding compost, a balanced fertilizer or well-aged manure. When you cannot be out in the garden, March is a good time to start many plants indoors to be transplanted later.

Keep a close eye on your outside plants and the weather from now until early May. Perennial plants and shrubs that made it through the winter and are starting to bud are often the most susceptible to a sudden temperature drop. If a frost or freeze is anticipated, consider covering special plants with a frost-protective row cover, a blanket or sheet. Just remember to uncover them when the temperature rises. (Garden row covers can remain on.)

Early in the month you should be able to plant bare-root berry bushes, strawberries, trees, grapevines, asparagus, as well as collards, onions, peas, radish, spinach and turnips. Fall seeding of lawns is preferable, but if you must reseed, now is the time for that. By mid-month you can direct sow cool season plants such as beets, carrots, lettuce and potatoes as well as poppies, larkspur and sweet peas in your flower garden and ground cover and many perennials.

March is also a good time to divide overcrowded perennials that bloom later in the year. Good candidates include Autumn Joy sedum, bee balm, black eyed Susan, liatris, hosta, liriope, New England asters, shasta daisy and yarrow. Stray canes from multi-stemmed shrubs like forsythia, lilac and shrub dogwoods can also be cut from the parent plant, dug up and replanted where they have room to grow. If you cannot find space for all the newly created plants your neighbors or local school gardens might welcome new plants.
