Trash cans have been a sore spot for the residents lately. Because of this, the BOD will be meeting with the ARC to help find a way to manage this issue. Although the meeting has yet to be scheduled, please make a note when the meeting will be held if you would like to attend.

The vacant BOD seat has been filled by Dave Webster. Dave was a member of the board for many years and has been a resident of Sugarland for over 20 years. He will be filling the seat until it expires in November.

Last but not least, the BOD creating a memorial bench on the lake in remembrance of Alicia Winterbottom who was a resident of Sugarland Run for many years and served on the ARC and BOD.

Native Plants for Native Pollinators by Diane Bayless

With such a wet year, it has been a challenge to follow normal planting guidelines for our area. Hopefully, by the time you receive this newsletter the soil will have dried sufficiently and the air warmed enough to plant cold-tolerant crops and flowers. As you dream about your spring, summer and fall garden full of beautiful flowers, tomatoes, peppers, beans and other foods, consider creating or adding to your space for pollinator-friendly plants.

Aside from the beauty butterflies and hummingbirds bring to our gardens, they, along with bees, the most prolific pollinators, are essential for ensuring the ongoing availability of the vast majority of plants. More than 75% of our food crops depend on pollinators for the successful fertilization of seeds for future generations. Unfortunately, pollinators have suffered lately from loss of habitat and overuse of pesticides.

Gardeners can help by creating spaces that support pollinators. Native plants that have adapted over time to our soil, growing season and climate are often the best source for pollen and nectar needed by pollinators. Many people are familiar with the need to plant milkweed for Monarch butterfly caterpillars, but forget to plant the nectar flowers the adult Monarchs need in the fall. Other butterflies have different, but specific, plant needs. Learning what specific plants are needed and choosing plants that flower at different times during the growing season will help you create a garden that will meet the needs of a variety of pollinators.
