POOL PASS HOURS

In order to obtain a pool pass, each member of your household six (6) years and older will need to come to the SRHOA office and have their picture taken. Each member MUST provide the association with one of the following forms of identification:

- A. Driver's license with current SRHOA property address
- B. Walker's permit (non-driver picture ID issued by DMV) with current SRHOA property address
- C. Recent (within three months) Utility Bill with residents name listed
- D. VA voter registration with property address
- E. Recent (within three months) Bank Statement with property address
- F. Children between the ages of 6 and 18 must provide a current report card of the schools in the community (unless providing driver's license) and must be accompanied by a parent with either A,B, C, D, or E (above).
- G. Tenants must provide a copy of their CURRENT lease and the owner MUST sign the pool application granting authorization for their tenants to use the pool. Tenants are also required to provide proof of residency with either A, B, C, D, or E (above).. (Landlord must release their rights to use the pool annually to their tenants.)

Residents may obtain their passes during the following hours **ONLY**:

WEEKDAY HOURS BEGINNING May 1, 2019:

8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

EVENING AND WEEKENDS:

In May and June the office will be open the following additional hours for passes:

Saturday, May 18 from 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.
Tuesday, May 21 from 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.
Thursday, May 23 from 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.
Wednesday, June 5 from 5:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.
Monday, June 10 from 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.
Wednesday, June 12 from 5:00 p.m. – 6:30 p.m.
Monday, June 17 from 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.

TENANTS MUST CONTACT THEIR LANDLORDS REGARDING POOL PASS ACTIVATION. HOMEOWNER'S ACCOUNT(S) MUST BE PAID UP-TO-DATE IN ORDER TO USE THE POOL. REPLACEMENT CARD FEE: \$20.00

All tenants, regardless if 2018 pool passes were received, must contact their landlords regarding activation of 2019 pool passes.

Native Plants for Pollinators Part 2 by Diane Bayless

Last month I wrote about the importance of native plants in the garden to attract and support native pollinators. Following my own advice, I have been busy scouting out native plant nurseries and events to pick up a variety of plants to add to my own garden and the one I am helping students plant at Sugarland Elementary School. There will still be some events in early May (many listed at https://www.plantnovanatives.org/local-native-plant-sales) where I probably will still be looking for some of the plants listed below.

Butterflies are attracted to a wide variety of flowers, but prefer bright colors with a faint fresh scent. They like a place to land while seeking nectar, and do well with small clusters of flowers. Buddleia, widely sold as "butterfly bush" does attract butterflies, but they are NOT native plants, do NOT support butterfly larvae and they ARE invasive. Their seeds are spread by wind so even carefully tended plants can escape from the garden and aggressively invade and destroy wild habitats where they overtake native plants. I admit I loved the one I had, but got rid of it to be a better caretaker of our native environment. (Next to go will be my invasive Bradford pear tree!) Some better alternatives include New Jersey Tea, Virginia Sweetspire, Wild Indigo, Spicebush, Sweetpepper bush, Joe Pye, Butterfly Weed, Milkweed and Asters.

Hummingbirds are also generally attracted to flowers with bright colors, especially orange, red, and purple. They care less about scent, but prefer trumpet, funnel or tube-shaped flowers with ample but deeply hidden nectar. Bee Balm, Cardinal Flower, Lupines, Salvia, Trumpet Vine, Bleeding Hearts, Petunias and Columbine are some of their favorites.

Many people want to discourage bees from invading their garden space, fearing they will get stung. Most bees are not aggressive. They just want to be left alone to gather nectar and pollen. (Yellow jackets will sting, but they are wasps, not bees.) Some favored flowers for bees include Catmint, Bee Balm, Calendula, Sedum, Lavender, and Borage.

One last thought: a "garden" need not be a huge space. As long as it gets ample sunlight and you can meet the water needs of the plants, a container, even on a balcony, can be home to a few plants. But remember, no matter where your garden is, using pesticides on your plants will harm those pollinators you are trying to attract and protect.
