## Hello Neighbors

Pool season is officially over and Fall is ahead of us.

The pool has been winterized and the covers placed on both pools. Preparations are being made for the next pool season with discussions to include equipment replacement, lifeguarding, and overall aesthetics of the pool. The Board is currently gathering information on these items to make next year better.

The next issue at hand is Willow Lake. As you may have noticed, the fountain was replaced and worked well for a couple weeks, then the fountain no longer working. It seems like the lake management company needs to come and clean it out fairly regularly to keep it running. This is not how it should be. We are having discussions with the pond management company to resolve this issue.

Part of the problem with the lake is the algae growth. This is mostly due to the excessive nutrients that makes its way into the lake, mainly fertilizers. The other problem is, sadly, human trash that gets dumped into the lake. If this situation is going to get better, we have to do what we can to keep trash out of the lake.

Let's remember to pick up after ourselves and our pets to keep our community litter free. Much of what ends up in the lake can also make its way into the creek and further into the Potomac River. Not only that, but the trash around the creek and trails leaves it very unsightly for those of us who walk them daily.

Many moons ago, a decision was made to keep the logs on the property for resident use. However, trees that are being cut are outpacing the logs being removed by residents. Therefore, the board has requested Premier to start removing the logs that are currently being cut, as well as the remaining logs on the property to be removed. The idea is that it will create a more aesthetically pleasing community.

The Board is currently working on making changes to the documents to include the Declaration, By-Laws, CCR (Convenants, Conditions, and Restrictions). This will be a huge feat for the Board to complete. We need your help to make this a success. If you have any input, please let us know. The changes are due to resident requests to do things our currently documents do not allow. Please come to the meetings or listen to the recording on Twitch to hear the updates.

#### **Protecting our Waterways** by Diane Bayless

A resident came to a recent Board meeting concerned about trash – plastic bottles, shoes, etc. - being flushed out of the stormwater drains along the creek creating an eyesore and pollution in the area. We are checking with the county to see if they intend to clean up the trash once all of the drainpipes have been flushed, and will request that they consider other methods to catch this debris during future flushing. Beyond that, we all should consider how we can help.

Waste water that enters the sanitary sewer system – water that goes down the drains inside buildings – travels to a wastewater treatment facility or septic system. Here pollutants are filtered out and the water is treated before it enters our waterways. Stormwater drains, on the other hand – those grates and opening along the roadways and in parking lots and other paved areas – move water directly to the nearest waterway, pond, stream or river without filtering or treatment or any kind. They are designed to quickly move rainwater and snowmelt so our roads do not flood.

Unfortunately, this water, including run off from roofs, driveways, bare soil and sloped lawns, gathers pollutants along the way. This includes visible trash - a small ball, plastic bottle, cigarette butt or items left in the street. Other pollutants may be less noticeable but potentially more hazardous to the water and the environment – pet waste, motor oils spilled on a driveway, soapy water from washing your car, or pesticides and fertilizers that landed on the driveway. Even leaves and grass clippings raked to the street or eroded soil that washes into the stormwater drains can pollute the waterway.

Our little creek runs into Sugarland Run, from there to the Potomac River and eventually to the Chesapeake Bay. Our tap water comes from the Potomac River. Fortunately, it is treated so it is safe to drink, but the more pollutants that enter the water, the more costly is to purify the water, not to mention its unsightly appearance and hazard to humans and wildlife. We all need to do our part to ensure fewer pollutants and less trash make their way to our water systems. Never dump anything into the stormwater drains and pay attention to what might unintentionally be washed into the drains. Together we can help keep our community safer and more attractive and keep our waterways safe for all.
