- Make sure children wear a proper fitting helmet, wrist guards, knee pads, elbow pads, and closed-toe shoes that have soles that do not slip.
- Never ride in the street or hitch a ride from a bicycle, car, truck, bus or other vehicle.
- Only ride the scooter or skateboard in daylight or best visibility
- Make sure your child wears proper fitting helmet, bright colored clothing and reflective gear.
- Use a white front light and a rear red light at night or when visibility is poor.
- Check the bike to ensure the brakes, lights, reflectors and tires are working properly.
- Teach children the rules of the road. Bicycles are considered vehicles and must obey the same rules as motorists.

# Hello Neighbors

At recent Board meetings the Board approved proposals for trail repairs, tree removal and the addition of Silo Mill Court for streetlight replacement in 2020. You may have noticed contractors – Finlay Asphalt, Premier Landscaping and CMI - in the neighborhood as they work on these projects. All of these projects are part of ongoing maintenance works and it is anticipated that they will wrap up completely in the Fall. Your patience and understanding for any inconvenience is appreciated.

As we enter the last few months of 2020 the Board will be considering proposals for the pool fencing and pool covers – both of these projects are to replace items that are past their economic life – as well as various other capital works projects as proposals are received and the 2020 budget permits.

There have been ongoing discussions about the amendments to the SRHOA Governing Documents. Townhall meetings have been held for the past several months which have resulted in some robust discussions about the proposed amendments. # Saving Seeds for Next Year by Diane Bayless

By the time this newsletter comes out I may be tired of eating summer squash from my garden, but hopefully still enjoying fresh beans and tomatoes. Now is the time to start thinking about saving seeds for next year. Seeds can be saved from many flowers and vegetables to ensure you have the varieties you enjoy, perpetuate heirloom varieties and to save money for next year's garden.

The best seeds to save are those from open pollinated plants. Hybrids and those that cross-pollinated from different varieties generally will not produce plants that are identical to the parent plant. Self-pollinating plants such as lettuce, beans and peas generally will produce the best results. I may also experiment with tomatoes and squash, recognizing the risk that there might have been some cross pollination since I planted a number of varieties.

To save seeds from dry-fruited plants, like beans and flowers such as marigolds, leave a few pods or flower heads on the plant until they have dried and turned brown. For the beans, harvest the pods, dry them for an additional week or two, then shell to collect the seeds. For flowers and many herbs, collect seeds once flower heads have dried.

For wet fruits like tomatoes, pick fully ripened fruit. Cut and squeeze the pulp into a container. Add a small amount of water and allow the mixture to ferment for up to four days at room temperature. When seeds settle, pour off the pulp and spread the seeds on paper towels to dry thoroughly.
